PMI has supported Niger to fight malaria since **2017**



Niger's entire **26.2 million** population is at risk for malaria



Malaria is a major burden in the country, with **7.7 million cases and 34,100 deaths** in 2022\*



The rainy season is from **July to October**

## PMI'S PROGRAM IN NIGER

The U.S. President's Malaria Initiative (PMI) provides vital financial and technical assistance that enables the Government of Niger to deploy lifesaving interventions proven to fight malaria.

PMI is a critical funding source for insecticide-treated nets, malaria diagnosis and treatment, and more. PMI investments also support stronger, more-resilient health systems. For example, PMI helps train health workers, strengthen supply chains, improve data monitoring, and reinforce health policies.

PMI Niger's fiscal year 2023 budget was \$20 million. PMI investments support and build on those made by the Government of Niger, in coordination with other stakeholders. PMI investments are detailed in the Malaria Operational Plan for Niger\*\*, which was developed in consultation with the National Malaria Control Program, other donors, and technical organizations. Planned PMI activities reflect national and PMI strategies, draw on best-available data, and align with the country context and health system.

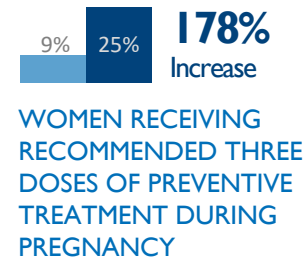
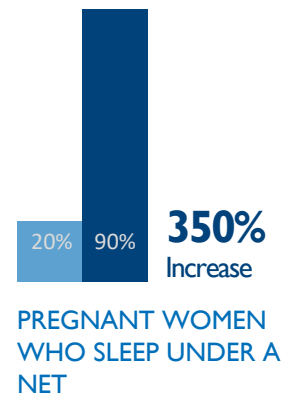
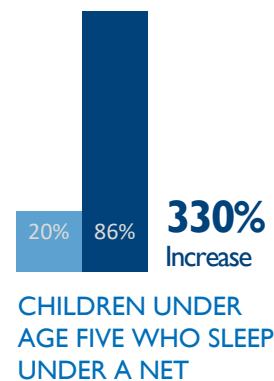
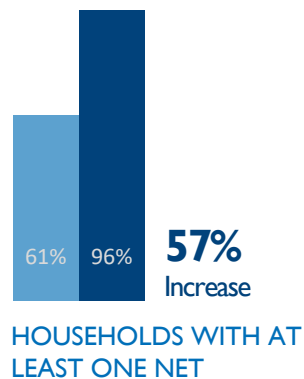
# PMI'S IMPACT ON NIGER'S MALARIA FIGHT

Since partnering with PMI, Niger has made progress against malaria. Child death rates have fallen and lifesaving interventions such as mosquito nets and preventive treatment for pregnant women are reaching more people. Health systems are stronger and health workers have received more than 59,500 trainings to help them fight malaria.
